



**Pt 3: Generations**

1. The suffering generation was wounded by what happened to them, and their pain hardened into mistrust. How have suffering, disappointment, or family history shaped the way you trust God?
2. The self-sufficient generation learned to survive without trust. What are some ways competence, planning, or responsibility can become a substitute for prayerful dependence on God?
3. Judges 2:10 says that another generation arose "who did not know the Lord or the work that he had done for Israel." What spiritual stories, practices, or convictions need to be passed on more intentionally to the next generation?
4. Judges ends with the repeated problem: "There was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes." Why is the answer to generational cynicism not merely better strategy, but the reign of Christ as King?
5. The closing idea was that "generational brokenness may run in your family, but so can generational grace." Where do you need to believe that Christ can write a new story through you?
