- 6) Which one of the following 3 Principles of Biblical Authenticity is the biggest challenge for you and why?
 - 3 Principles of Biblical Authenticity:
 - 1) KNOW who you are.
 - 2) UNDERSTAND who you are.
 - 3) **BE** who you are.
- 7) What are your thoughts about Augustine's quote: "How can you draw close to God when you are far from your own self?" and its correlation to Psalm 125 and the topic of AUTHENTICITY. How can you be more authentic this week?
