



## **Part 2 – Price**

Icebreaker: Pastor Tom mentioned growing up with the myth of "Fan Death" (that sleeping with a fan on will kill you). What is a weird or totally unscientific rule or superstition your family passed down?

- 1) Read 1 Peter 1:13-25 as a Life Group (recommend reading slowly and twice if time allows). What words or phrases stood out to you? What might God be saying to you through this passage?
- 2) Peter tells us to "gird up the loins of your mind" - to stay alert and not get too comfortable, since we're not home yet. Where in your life right now are you most tempted to settle in and forget you're just passing through?
- 3) Pastor Tom shared how his family's scoreboard was achievement (grades, sports, leadership). What was the "scoreboard" in your family growing up - the unspoken thing that earned love or approval? How do you see it still showing up in you today?
- 4) The Greek word λυτρόω (ransomed) was a slave-market word - a price paid, chains removed, ownership changed. How does thinking of your salvation as a purchase (rather than just forgiveness) change how you see your worth?
- 5) One of the points in the sermon was how rescue comes first, then holiness follows (Exodus then Sinai; hope then holiness) - not the reverse. Does your relationship with God currently feel more like earning approval or living from acceptance already given? What would change if you fully believed the order is rescue, then response?
- 6) Of the three practical steps - name the heirloom, preach the price, love expensively - which one is hardest for you this week, and why? Share these as prayer topics for this week for one another.
