- 2) Read Ecclesiastes 2 aloud, together. What elements stand out to you and why? What is the main point of King Solomon's sharing here?
- 3) The word "blessed" is repeated 9 times throughout Matthew 5:1-11. The original Greek word is μακάριος (mak'arios) which primarily means "happy" or *fortunate, favored, privileged*. How does this affect your interpretation of the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:2-12)?
- 4) Pastor Tom shared "2 Kingdom Principles" in this past Sunday's message. What were those principles and what makes them so significant in our lives today?
- 5) Describe what "poor in spirit" (Matthew 5:3) means and why do you think those who have it, also have the "kingdom of heaven"?
- 6) Discuss the following quote "Humility is not thinking less of yourself, it's thinking of yourself less." (Rick Warren) and its relation to the Allegory of the Long Spoons and their relation to the first Beatitude. How can you incorporate some of these gleanings in your life this week?
