Part 3: The Flood (Genesis 6-9)

In this series, we'll see how being human is inherently messy, with stories of strained relationships, violence, distrust, and fear. Yet, Genesis teaches us about perseverance and finding hope in God, revealing His promises that protect and sustain us even in the unexpected turns of life. Through our exploration of Creation, the Fall, the Flood, and the Tower of Babel, alongside the narratives of patriarchs Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph, we'll discover how these stories foreshadow the gospel and offer transformative insights for our personal lives and the world around us.

- 1) Read Genesis 6:5-7. What do you think it means that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually?

- 2) Of the three points below, which one challenges you, encourages you, or hits home? Please explain and elaborate.
 - a. Noah was NOT a good man.
 - b. Noah's Ark is not a children's story.
 - c. The rainbow is not the end of the story.

- 3) As you look through Genesis chapters 6-9, what is the moral of the story of Noah's Ark? And do you see any parallels to the Gospel message? How so?

- 4) Knowing the moral of the story, what are the implications for us? What do you think are the practical things God now calls us to? In other words, what are your next steps personally and/or corporately?
