- 3. "The book of Galatians is a book on the gospel, expounding the gospel, articulating the gospel, pounding the gospel to Christians. [But] maybe you're like I am, and that is, maybe you have also thought, 'There's the gospel which is milk, and then you move on to meat.' You never move on. The gospel is the milk, it is the meat, it is the appetizer, it is the dessert, and it is everything." Timothy Keller

Read and discuss the quote above. Why do you suppose there are some who believe the gospel is elementary, especially for those who've been attending church for a while? What is that? How might that mentality be detrimental to one's true spiritual growth and maturity.
