RFCAP

SCRIPTURF

KEY PASSAGES: Matthew 18:15-35, 19:16-30 & 20:20-28

MEMORY VERSE: Matthew 20:26-28 "Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave—just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

DISCUSS

- 1. Read Matthew 18:15-35. Regarding relationships between one another, how does the world typically operate? Based on Jesus' response and parable, what should characterize our relationships according to the Kingdom of God?
- 2. Read Matthew 19:16-30. The disciples were so astounded to hear Jesus say how difficult it is for the rich to enter the Kingdom because they believed wealth was a sign of blessing and favor from God. If anyone could be saved, they thought it would be the rich. What does Jesus' encounter with the rich young man reveal to us about how God's Kingdom works? What implications does that have for us today when it comes to our resources and wealth?
- 3. Read Matthew 20:20-28. When it comes to power, what does it look like in the world compared with what Jesus says it looks like in God's Kingdom? Why is this important for us today? How can you embody the value of service this week?
- 4. Jesus addressed how to navigate relationships, money and power according to His Kingdom all of which we tend to struggle with at times. Which one of these stands out to you the most in this season? How can your group pray for you?
