



## 1. Opening

### **Purpose for Digs and Prayer (1 min)**

Digs gather to study, pray, and apply the Word of God to our lives. Our hope is that we would increase in our love for God, love for one another, and tell others about Him (Matt 22:37-40; Matt 28:19-20).

### **Weekly Christian Formation (5 min)**

**Question 25\*** Does Christ's death mean all our sins can be forgiven?

**Answer:** Yes, because Christ's death on the cross fully paid the penalty for our sin, God graciously imputes Christ's righteousness to us as if it were our own and will remember our sins no more.

**Scripture Reference:** 2 Corinthians 5:21

Scripture Reference: Revelation 18:1-24

1. In verses 1-3, what is the source behind the powers of Babylon?
2. How did these evil powers deceive the kings, merchants, and sailors?
3. If Babylon represents an evil authority, why did the kings, merchants, and sailors mourn the loss of Babylon?

4. What is the command given to God's people in verse 4? Why?

5. What does it mean to "come out of" Babylon?

6. In what ways do we find comfort and joy from things in this world?

7. What is the command given to saints in verse 20?

8. What is to be the source of our joy?

9. Revelation 18 describes the end of evil. Will we rejoice or mourn at the fall of Babylon? The source of our hope will determine that. How can you turn from the deception of evil and find your hope in Christ alone?

## 3. Confession and Prayer (30-45 minutes)

Prayer: Reserve plenty of time to pray for one another.

Prayer Challenge: Pray that God would provide opportunities for you to share Christ with people. Pray that you will make the most of every opportunity (Col 4:2-6)
