- LORD Over the Chaos John 13:36-38, 14:1-14
- Pray for God's wisdom to rightly understand the passage

Questions

- 1. What is the central theme of John 14:1-14?
- 2. In verse 1 the original Greek, "be troubled" is actually one word and it is a verb. The closest meaning we have is for this word is "shudder." So another translation for verse 1 could be, "Don't let your heart shudder." How does that change your view of Christs command to the disciples?
- 3. This command to not let your hearts shudder is not an all-inclusive command meaning Christ isn't saying you can never be afraid. When does this apply and why does that matter?
- 4. When Jesus says he is the way, the truth and the life in verse 6, what does he mean when he says he is the truth and how does that apply to his conversation with the disciples in this moment?
- 5. What is the overall meaning of verses 12-14?
- 6. How does this portion of the Farewell Discourse (verses 1-14) encourage you? How does it convict you?
- 7. What area in your life do you need boldness i.e. what do you need to ask of the Lord so that he will do it like it says in verses 14?

Closing

- Prayer: Reserve plenty of time to pray for one another.
- Prayer Challenge: Pray that God would provide opportunities for you to share Christ with people.
- Pray that you would make the most of every opportunity (Col 4:2-6).
