Read: Matthew 9:1-8 (ESV)

And getting into a boat he crossed over and came to his own city. ² And behold, some people brought to him a paralytic, lying on a bed. And when Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Take heart, my son; your sins are forgiven." ³ And behold, some of the scribes said to themselves, "This man is blaspheming." ⁴ But Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? ⁵ For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise and walk'? ⁶ But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he then said to the paralytic—"Rise, pick up your bed and go home." ⁷ And he rose and went home. ⁸ When the crowds saw it, they were afraid, and they glorified God, who had given such authority to men.

- Why do you think Jesus first forgave the paralyzed man's sins before physically healing him?
- How did the teachers of the law react to Jesus' words? Why did they react this way?
- How did Jesus demonstrate His authority to forgive sins?
- Discuss the concept of Jesus' authority to forgive sins. What does that mean for us today?

- How does the faith of the paralyzed man (and those who brought him) apply to our lives today?
- What are some ways we can demonstrate our faith in Jesus' authority?
