Text: Genesis 4:26b – "At that time people began to call upon the name of the Lord."

Introduction:

• Significance: This is the first recorded act of prayer in the Bible, signaling humanity's recognition of the need for divine connection.

What We Pray:

- 1. **Place** We are separated from the place of God.
 - Humanity was physically removed from Eden, the perfect environment where they walked with God.
 - Sin displaced us, and prayer becomes the means by which we seek to reconnect with God's divine order and direction.
 - o **Application:** Prayer is how we seek to align ourselves with God's will and His plans, even in a fallen world.
- 2. **Presence** We are separated from the presence of God.
 - The intimacy of walking with God in the garden was replaced with distance.
 - Prayer is necessary to restore fellowship with God, to draw near to Him, and to experience His presence through the Holy Spirit.
 - Application: Prayer is not just about asking for things but about being with God and knowing Him personally.
- 3. **Peace** We are separated from the peace of God.
 - o Sin brought fear, anxiety, and turmoil into the world.

- o Prayer becomes the way to restore peace in the midst of a chaotic and broken world.
- **Application:** Through prayer, we experience the peace of God that surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:6-7).
