GETTING REAL

From the beginning of time, one of the most successful plans of the devil against humanity has been to promote fatherless homes. According to a report of the US Department of Health and Human Services, 7 out of 10 African American, 4 out of 10 Hispanic, and 3 out of 10 Caucasian kids are born out of wedlock. Some of the consequences of these statistics are that 90% of homeless or runaway children, 71% of pregnant teenagers, 63% of youth suicides, 85% of youth in prisons and 75% of adult prisoners come from fatherless homes. America spends \$59.9 billion each year due to fatherlessness.

WE HAVE A FATHER (ROMANS 8:14-16)

Adam and Eve were not just a part of God's creation; they were His children.

"For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God." Romans 8:14 NiV

The Bible calls Jesus the first born of God because every human being who has been saved by the blood of Christ is a son or a daughter of God.

Result - When a father protects his family, they grow up secure, they fear no evil.

A FATHER'S LOVE MAKES HIM A GIVER OF IDENTITY

Jesus Knew a Loving and Accepting Father

"...and a voice came out of the heavens: "You are My Beloved Son, in You I am well-pleased." Mark 1:11 NASB

While he was still speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and behold, a voice out of the cloud said, "This is My Beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to Him!" Matthew 17:5 NASB
