Ephesians 5:18–21

¹⁸ And don't get drunk with wine, which leads to reckless living, but <u>be filled by the</u> <u>Spirit</u>: ¹⁹ speaking to one another in psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, singing and making music with your heart to the Lord, ²⁰ giving thanks always for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ <u>submitting yourselves</u> to one another in reverence for the Lord.

"Submit" A military term meaning:

To position oneself to defend, protect and support their fellow soldiers (as we serve under a commanding leader)

Ephesians 5: 22-24; 25-30; 33

²² <u>WIVES</u>, submit to your husbands <u>as</u> to the Lord,

²³ because the husband is the <u>head</u> of the wife <u>as</u> Christ is the head of the Church. He is the Savior of the body.

²⁴Now <u>as</u> the Church submits to Christ, so also wives are to submit to their husbands in everything.

²⁵ <u>HUSBANDS,</u> love your wives, <u>just as</u> Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her...

²⁸ In the same way, husbands are to love their wives **<u>as</u>** their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself.

²⁹ For no one ever hates his own flesh but **provides** and **cares** for it, **just as** Christ does for the church...

³³ To sum up, each one of you is to <u>LOVE</u> his wife <u>as</u> himself, and the wife is to <u>RESPECT</u> her husband.
