
UNDER THE UMBRELLA

In Matthew 6:10 Jesus tells us to pray, "Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." We've learned that this aspect of prayer serves as an umbrella under which all of our prayers should come. Receiving daily bread is a resource of the Kingdom and the will of the Father (Mt.6:11). Verse 12 says,

"And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors."

If the alignment of His will with our prayers holds true, then **forgiveness** is another significant benefit of the Kingdom. Paying close attention, as Abiders, we notice that Jesus doesn't instruct us to simply pray for forgiveness.

We are to pray for forgiveness in accordance with our own demonstration of forgiveness to others, "as we also have forgiven..."




CHECK YOURSELF

This prayer should cause us to pause and ask, "Have I forgiven my debtors?" If the answer is no, then our prayer should proceed by asking for more of God's heart, filled with compassion and mercy toward those who have sinned against us. Matthew 6:14-15 states, "For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions."

Forgiveness is in the Kingdom ("Your kingdom come"). Forgiveness is the Father's will ("Your will be done"). Forgiveness should be active in the life of every abiding follower of Christ. Not only because we have

received it, but also because we give it willingly and freely to others. Like prayer, forgiveness shouldn't be viewed as a burden, but one of the most direct ways in which we as Abiders have an opportunity to demonstrate God's love and mercy to others as He has given us.

Father I ask You today to give me a heart after Your heart. Help me Lord to see others as You see them and to give mercy as You have also given to me (Luke 6:36). Expose any unforgiveness in my life and help me release others and myself from bondage (Psalm 139:23-24). Remove all stubbornness and arrogance my heart and help me to walk in humility before You (James 4:6). Lead me to show forgiveness wherever needed and to take joy in the cross of Christ. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.
