## what is BSALT

#### Baptists Seeking Souls in America's Lost Towns

#### THE FACTS

BSALT has spent months of research to map Independent, fundamental, non-Calvinistic, KJV only, Baptist churches by county. The influence of independent, fundamental Baptists in the United States is diminishing. There are over 900 counties that do not have an IFB Church that meet the criteria listed above.

#### THE FOCUS

BSALT is a soul-winning ministry that believes the only hope for America is the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. BSALT assists churches and church planters to invite thousands of people to know the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior with an organized effort called "Operations", assist in soul-winner training, and other tools, to better equip Believers in sharing the Gospel.

#### THE FERVENCY •

BSALT works with the church planter or pastor over several weeks to provide training, and other tools to educate and train Believers in your church, and goes to work to plan and organize an "Operation". An "Operation" is a specific goal of reaching: a means of inviting 1,000, 2,500, 5,000, or 10,000 people to the Lord Jesus Christ as Saviour. Upon completion of the "Operation" the church will have effectively witnessed to a community, gained church prospects and hopefully see souls saved.



## Bur PURPOSE)



#### Report

Our first objective is to give you the "State of the Union" address. Just over 10 years ago our founder, Pastor Steven Sykes, was led of the Lord to map out all of our Independent, Fundamental, Baptist Churches in America. He believed God would use this as a guide to show us our greatest areas of need for church planting. After six months the data was completed and the first BSALT Map came to be. Now, 10 years later, he, along with the BSALT team have completed the same task; yet this time on a city level.

#### Replant

The second objective is to take this data and put it into the hands of as many Pastors, Churches, Bible Colleges, Mission Boards; etc. and equip them with the information and resources they need to replant America with as many IFB Churches as possible. If every IFB church in America planted one church, we would still need over 10,000 churches to adequately reach America alone!



#### Reach

The final objective is to launch BSALT Remote. This initiative will go into America's lost towns; (communities that have no IFB Church) and host soul winning campaigns where we will knock on anywhere between 2,500-10,000 doors in a week. Contacts made in that city will be given access to an online resource where they can watch live-stream church services, speak with a Pastor remotely, and be discipled by-proxy. Our ultimate goal would be to see a church planted in that area, and once the Church planter is on the field we turn all of those contacts over to him as a starting point for the new church.

# The BASICS

Over the last several months the BSALT team has researched the country to find every IFB Church in America. We use three different databases, compare those lists, and then research each individual church to make sure they meet our criteria. If a church qualifies to make our list, we add them to our list and place a pin on the US Map.

#### The Criteria:

- Only uses the King James Bible (for English Speaking People)
- Non-Calvinistic
- Traditional worship style (non carnal/worldly)

#### How do we know?

Every church on our starting databases is personally researched by a member of the BSALT Team. We study the doctrinal statements and watch/listen to a portion of any posted services online.

#### The Problem?

As we know it is impossible to find every IFB church in America. Many churches have no media presence whatsoever, and others do no have any information listed. We never intentionally leave a church off of our list, but do recognize the fact that we may have missed some. This list is in no way an endorsement of a church, just a resource. Pastors change, churches open and close and all we can do is make a common sense decision on who qualifies.

# The STATS

Throughout the rest of the book you'll find the United States of America broken down into six distinct regions. Each region represent individual states where we have compiled data on the most needed areas of America.

#### **Numbers & Stats**

After compiling the list of churches, we broke down the numbers on a city, state, and regional level. To come up with our *percentage reached* stat we took the number of existing churches and multiplied it by 5,000. (We are calculating based on the assumption that every church represented is reaching 5,000 people with the gospel each year). We then took that number and divided it by the 2020 census population for that city. *Example: San Diego, CA has 3 existing churches to reach a population of 1.38 million people. If those 3 churches are taking the gospel to 5,000 people a year, they're currently reaching 1.08% total of their city.* 

To come up with our **churches needed** stat, we took the current population of the city and divided it by 5,000. We then subtracted how many existing churches are in the city.

Example: San Diego - 1.38 million / 5,000= 276 - 3 (existing churches) 273

So  $\it San Diego needs 273 more churches$  to adequately reach their population.

If the 3 existing churches determined to reach the whole city in one year, they would each be responsible to reach 462,310 people with the Gospel.

To come up with our *Most Needed* lists, we took the burden on existing churches statistic and arranged them from largest to smallest.

Example: San Diego has 3 Churches to reach 1.38 million people; requiring them to reach 462,310 people. Whereas, Los Angeles has 14 churches to reach 3,898,747 people requiring them to reach 278,481. Though Los Angeles needs 756 churches and San Diego needs 273; the burden to reach their community is heavier on San Diego.

#### "Top 100" lists defined:

- Red List represents the top 100 cities in America without an IFB Church.
- Yellow List represents the greatest need for churches in cities that already have existing churches
- True Top 100 is a combination of red and yellow based on their population vs. burden of existing churches.
