Additional Ways to Praise: <u>1.Standing</u>

Exodus 33:10 says, "Whenever the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the entrance to the tent, they all stood and worshiped, each at the entrance to his tent." • Standing is an act of honor. • We stand in worship because it shows our

respect for God.





2. Lying Prostate

1 Kings 18:39 says, "When all the people saw this, they fell prostrate and cried, "The LORD - he is God! The LORD - he is God!" Nehemiah 8:6 says, "Ezra praised the LORD, the great God; and all the people lifted their hands and responded, 'Amen! Amen!' Then they bowed down and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground."





Laying before God is an act of reverence

• Too often we never reach this state because we are so busy talking to God that we give Him little or no chance to speak to us.





3.Bowing our Head-

2 Chronicles 29:30 says, "King Hezekiah and his officials ordered the Levites to praise the LORD with the words of David and of Asaph the seer. So they sang praises with gladness and bowed their heads and worshiped."

This is also a posture of honor and respect





4.Laughter

Job 8:21-He will once again fill your mouth with laughter and your lips with shouts of joy.

 It's an expression of pure joy and wonder following a difficult season





5.Speaking and Singing in Tongues 1 Corinthians 14:15 King James Version (KJV) 15 What is it then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also: I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also.





Speaking in tongues is a normal part of praise, it's speaking to God in the spirit

Speaking in tongues is a personal gift from the Lord to us and it can be used in praise and worship.

Praise is so Powerful- Story of Jehoshaphat Jehoshaphat bragged on and boasted in the Lord. He proclaimed that power and might are in God's hands! He reminded God of what He had already done and confirmed his faith that God would do it again!

Praise is so Powerful- Story of Jehoshaphat

- They praised God so hard, they declared His goodness,
- •They expected that when they praised Him, He will show up and show out
- •They were obedient to their leader, when he commanded them to praise God they praised Him!



Praise is so Powerful-Story of Jehoshaphat • In verse 21 it talked about the "splendor of God's holiness" His holiness means "He can't do anything other than what has promised"

•The soldiers rejoiced in God's faithfulness before God had even been faithful to them, why?

• Because they believed if they praised God, and had an expectancy that God is going to do what He said He would do, that He would show





• We cannot come into service without and expectancy when we praise or we will come in and leave out the same way.

 God created us with a weapon inside of us that if activated by faith, humility and obedience, it will cause God to show up and show out, and that's praise!
