1) Exposing the power of faith
a. *The power isn't the faith itself but where the faith is placed
b. *Need + desire + faith, is a powerful equation
2) Alleviating pain
a. *The realities of pain meeting the promise of renewal
3) Restoring this man in profound \& comprehensive ways
a. *Materially, Spiritually, \& Relationally
b. *Foundational relationships of God, Self, Others
4) Revealing the tenderness of God's heart as well the power of God's hand
a. *The Power of God's hand in this case is the power of God's words
b. *The power was primarily in the word so the touch served a different purpose
5) Reinforcing the purpose of which he came
a. *Luke 4 is in full view; The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...He has anointed me to...
6) Redefining a paradigm around clean and unclean.
a. *Jesus doesn't become contaminated by coming in contact with the unclean, but what's unclean can be cleansed and changed when it comes into contact with Jesus
7) Forming His disciples
a. *His disciples are with Him as this is happening, so He's developing them from the ground up as they are in relationship with him

And afterward he shall kill the burnt offering.

The former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office, ${ }^{24}$ but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever. ${ }^{25}$ Consequently, he is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.
