Thirsting for more of God, from God, & out of life.

The **harvest**:

When he saw **the crowds**, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.

v36

The harvest is people from all walks of life experiencing all types of need.

The harvest entails special attention to the vulnerable within a society.

For the Lord your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality and accepts no bribes. ¹⁸ He defends the cause of <u>the</u> <u>fatherless</u> and <u>the widow</u>, and loves <u>the foreigner</u> residing among you, giving them food and clothing. ¹⁹ And you are to love those who are foreigners, for you yourselves were foreigners in Egypt.

Deuteronomy 10:17-19

"Because <u>the poor are plundered</u> and <u>the needy groan</u>, I will now arise," says the Lord. "I will protect them from those who malign them."

Learn to do right; **seek justice**. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow.

The harvest is cared for & ruled by God.

Jesus' heart:

he had **compassion** on them,

v36

God's rule:

Ask **the Lord of the harvest**, therefore, to send out workers into **his harvest field** v38

The harvest is plentiful.

Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is **plentiful** but the workers are few. v37

The workers:

Jesus went throughout Galilee, <u>teaching in their synagogues</u>, <u>proclaiming the good news of the kingdom</u>, <u>and healing every disease and sickness among the people</u>.

Matthew 4:23

Jesus went through all the towns and villages, <u>teaching in their synagogues</u>, <u>proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness</u>.

Matthew 9:35

Jesus <u>called his twelve disciples to him</u> and <u>gave them authority</u> to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and sickness.

Matthew 10:1

As you go, <u>proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near</u>.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give.

See as Jesus sees:

Meanwhile his disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat something." ³² But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you know nothing about." ³³ Then his disciples said to each other, "Could someone have brought him food?" ³⁴ "My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. ³⁵ Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? <u>I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest</u>.

Feel as Jesus feels:

but the people there did not welcome him, because he was heading for Jerusalem. ⁵⁴ When the disciples James and John saw this, they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?" ⁵⁵ But Jesus turned and rebuked them. ⁵⁶ Then he and his disciples went to another village.

Compassion always costs the person who has it.

Do as Jesus does:

rather, <u>he made himself nothing</u> by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross!

The harvest needs workers who look like Jesus & are sent in the power of Jesus.

Partner with God in the harvest

What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul?
