Scripture Reading: Luke 18:1-8 Sermon Title: Encounters: Keep Praying

Being with Jesus is spending time with Jesus alone & with others, from a heart of devotion & towards deeper dedication.

- Take inventory of our hearts & time.
- Spend time in prayer.
- Spend time through scripture reading.

Be with Jesus by living a life of prayer.

And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. ² He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. ³ And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' ⁴ For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'" ⁶ And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. ⁷ And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? ⁸ I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" Luke 18:1-8

And he told them **<u>a parable</u>**

The parables of Jesus <u>are not</u> fables told to give a moral lesson, <u>they are</u> stories shared to reveal or explain ideas about Jesus, us, &/or The Kingdom of God.

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The widow gives us <u>a powerful model</u>, Jesus gives us the primary motivation.

And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says.⁷ And <u>will not God</u> give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night?

The judge is <u>annoyed</u> by the widow. God is <u>affectionate</u> towards the vulnerable.

The judge does a good thing for <u>a wrong reason</u>. God does good things for <u>the right reasons</u>.

The judge is **forced into action** by her action.

God is proactive yet <u>responsive to our actions</u>.

if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, **then** I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land.

2 Chronicles 7:14

God is moved by & moves with the prayers of His people.

The judge has absolute power with <u>atrocious character</u>. God has absolute power with <u>astonishing character</u>.

⁷And will not God give justice to his elect, who <u>cry to him day and night</u>?

The goodness & righteousness of God is the primary motivation Jesus gives to His disciples so that they would continue in prayer & not be consumed by despair.

And he said to them, "When you pray, say: "<u>Father</u>, hallowed be your name. Luke 11:2

And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. ¹¹ What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent;¹² or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? ¹³ If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, <u>how much more will the heavenly</u> <u>Father</u> give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him! Luke 11:9-12

And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart.

<u>Make the primary motivation</u> Jesus gives for continuing in prayer <u>your primary</u> <u>motivation</u>.

Accept it: Accept the motivation Jesus gives as the best motivation there is.

Practice it: Don't wait for an apparent need to activate our prayers, be proactive.

Lectio Divina

"P.R.A.Y." -Pete Grieg **Pause**, (quietly prepare your heart) **Read & Reflect** (lectio+ meditatio), (slowly read, rejoice, reflect, & repeat) **Ask** (oratio), (turn your reflections into prayer) **Yield** (*contemplatio*) (*enjoy the presence of God*)

Make the scriptures <u>the primary content</u> & your life <u>the primary context</u> of your prayers. Offer prayers <u>without</u> hedging them.
