# Sermon Title: It is not your OWN Scripture reading: Psalm 24:1, Psalm 147:1-11, Proverbs 27:23-27

## God calls us to responsible stewardship & growing generosity with our resources because He wants something for us <u>not</u> from us.

"If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for the world and its fullness are mine. Psalm 50:1

The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein, Psalm 24:1

#### Guiding Principle 1 It is not my own, it belongs to God.

## Steward:

A steward is a person who manages the resources of another.

## Stewardship:

Stewardship represents the activity of oversight & management of the resources someone has been entrusted with

Praise the Lord!
