- 4. How does this passage testify to the centrality, supremacy and simplicity of Christ? What do each of these words mean to you?

Read Hebrews 2:1-4

- 5. What is the connection between this passage and the opening of chapter 1?
- 6. What is "the things that we have heard" that the writer is referring to?
- 7. How do we "pay most careful attention"? What does this mean?
- 8. What does drifting away look like? How can the word drifting sometimes be applied to our faith journey?
- 9. What causes you to drift away? What brings you back?
- 10. Who was it that confirmed the gospel message to them? What other ways was it confirmed?
- 11. What encouragement and hope can we take from verse 4? What is this important?
