Read Matthew 21:1-11

- 1. What is Passover? Why is it important? What does its commemoration tell us about our connection to the past?
- 2. How did the Passover festival contribute to binding the people together as a community? What celebrations mould us together as a people?
- 3. How would the memory of the exodus be looked at under the country's occupation by Rome?
- 4. Why a donkey? What was the point of this? What message do you think Jesus was trying to send by entering Jerusalem this way?
- 5. What does this tell us about Jesus' mission and how he viewed what he was doing? Why was *how* he went about his mission so important?
- 6. What is power? Who has power in our society? How is it used?
- 7. What power did Jesus have? How did he use it? How does he expect us to use power in his name?
- 8. What does the power of Jesus look like? What does it do?
- 9. Who does not have power? Why not? How does Jesus want us to help the powerless?
- 10. What is your donkey ride? How do you model a different way of using power, for different ends, for people often ignored?

Prayer points:

- Spend time praying for the situation in Israel/Palestine and the people affected by the conflict.
- Pray for the recently arrived family from Afghanistan, particularly for a more permanent place to live.
