- 1. What is society's view of the resurrection? Why?
- 2. What do you think Mary Magdalene was thinking as she made her way to the tomb?
- 3. What do you know of Mary Magdalene? What history does she have with Jesus?
- 4. What is the significance of the first witness to the risen Jesus being a woman? Why would this be an issue?
- 5. Why do you think Mary did not recognise Jesus? What might this tell us about his resurrected body?
- 6. What is the significance of Mary encountering Jesus in a garden and mistaking him for a gardener? What resonances with other scripture passages does this have?
- 7. In verse 17, Jesus says, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father." What does he mean by this? Why would it be important?
- 8. What does the resurrection mean to you?
- 9. How has the resurrection altered your worldview? What changes has it meant for you?
- 10. What has God been saying to you this Easter? How will you respond?
