## Read Hebrews 3:7-4:13

- 1. Why does the writer bring the story of the Exodus into focus here? What does this tell us about the possible recipients of Hebrews?
- 2. What is God's rest? Why is it highlighted here?
- 3. What happened to the Israelites in the desert? How do you think a heart gets hardened?
- 4. What similarities are there between the Israelites in the desert and us?
- 5. Why did God rest? In this passage how is God's rest after creation analogous to the rest believers can enter?
- 6. What do we need to do to stop our hearts similarly hardening against God?
- 7. Why might some people fail to enter into rest? Why should this be a concern?
- 8. How is rest denied to people? Who are the people in the world most denied their rest?
- 9. How does God call us to support the oppressed and marginalised and fight for their right to rest? How are you currently doing this?
- 10. How can we help bring rest to people in the world who are currently denied it?

- Pray for the plight of refugees, the homeless, and the displaced around the world.
- Pray for the two families from Afghanistan soon to be arriving with us.
- Pray for those affected by violence and conflict around the globe.
