- 1. What do you know of Elijah's life and story? What had been happening leading up to this passage?
- 2. What role had Mount Horeb/Sinai played in the history of the Israelites up to this point? What was its significance?
- 3. Why had Elijah gone into the wilderness? What problems was he dealing with?
- 4. Has God ever asked you "what are you doing here?" Why?
- 5. Why does God often ask us questions like this?
- 6. What do you think of Elijah's response to God? Why did he respond this way?
- 7. What was God's point with the wind, the earthquake and the fire? Why did these events occur of God was not actually present in them?
- 8. Why was God in the whisper? Why was he not in the power of the wind, earthquake and fire? What does this tell us?
- 9. What is it about the aftermath of Elijah's experience of God's presence that shows us Elijah is still 'stuck' and has not moved on?
- 10. How might you be 'stuck' at the moment? How is God reaching out to you at this time to try and get you moving again?
- 11. What might you need to do to get moving again?
