- 5. What does it mean to be 'in Christ'? How does this happen? What does this look like day to day for you?
- 6. What did the death of Christ do for our four key relationships? How are they transformed and renewed?
- 7. How have you experienced renewal in our four key relationships in your life?
- 8. What does being reconciled to God require of us?
- 9. What are we God's co-workers in? How are we his ambassadors?
- 10. How are others experiencing the love of Christ through you?
- 11. How are new creation and reconciliation showing themselves in your life?
- 12. What is Christ compelling you to do/move towards? What is the new step in for you in experiencing Christ's love, sharing Christ's love, and bringing reconciliation?
