Read Genesis 25:19-34

- 1. What can you remember of the story of Jacob's life? What is your impression of him and his character?
- 2. Why is he such an important character in the bible?
- 3. Why was the relationship between Esau and Jacob fractious?
- 4. Why do you think Jacob asked for the birthright? What does this episode teach us about Jacob?
- 5. Why did God end up blessing Jacob? Why did he sanction Jacob's stealing of Esau's birthright?
- 6. On what other occasions does God favour the younger child over the older? What does this tell us about God?

Read Genesis 29:13-30

- 7. How did Laban trick Jacob? What does that suggest about Jacob? What does it suggest about sin and its consequences?
- 8. When has your faith in God been tested like Jacob's was with Rachel? What happened? How were you changed as a result?

Read Genesis 32:24-32

- 9. What does Jacob's new name, Israel, mean? Why is this significant?
- 10. What does it mean to wrestle with God and to have God wrestle with you? When does this happen in your life? Why?
- 11. What do you think Jacob had learned by the time he came to bless his children and grandchildren? How do you think his faith had grown in his final years?
- 12. How is Jacob's life a cautionary tale for us?
- 13. How does his life show us that God still loves and cares for us even when we sin?

- Pray for the plight of refugees, the homeless, and the displaced around the world.
- Pray for the two families from Afghanistan that are heading to us.
- Pray for those affected by violence and conflict and climate change around the globe.
