- 1. Why had Jesus commanded the disciples to wait in Jerusalem? Why was this important?
- 2. What was the point of the "wind and fire"? Why did Luke describe things in these terms?
- 3. What roles did wind and fire play in Scripture? In creation, rescue from exile, the tabernacle/Temple, the incarnation?
- 4. What does tell us about God's presence with people throughout history?
- 5. How are things now different because of Pentecost? What has changed?
- 6. What was the reaction of the disciples at Pentecost?
- 7. Read Luke 24:45-49. How is what happened at Pentecost important in relation to Jesus' commission to his disciples? How does it aid in the fulfilment of the Great Commission?
- 8. How is the sending of the Spirit missional?
- 9. What experiences of the power of the Holy Spirit have you had in your life lately?
- 10. What purpose does the power of the Holy Spirit carry? How does this power point to a God who is alive and active in the world?
- 11. What do you want/need God to do in your life right now? Where is the power of the Spirit most needed in your community?

Prayer points:

- Continue to pray for the situation in Israel/Palestine and in the Ukraine, and the people affected by these conflicts.
- Pray for the Spirit's guidance and power in your life.
