Read Psalm 27

- 1. What is desire? What does it mean to desire something and grow in that desire?
- 2. What desires do you have? What determines a good desire from a bad desire?
- 3. How do we grow in desire to be with God and dwell with him? How do we fan the flame of desire in our hearts?
- 4. What sort of place is the Psalmist in at the moment? What sort of situation do verses 2-3 paint a picture of?
- 5. What might you expect the Psalmist to ask for in such a situation? Why does he not ask for this?
- 6. What does the Psalmist mean when he says, "to gaze on the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple"? Why focus on the Lord's beauty?
- 7. Why do our desires so easily get distracted and disordered? Which desires of yours tend to squeeze out the desire for God?
- 8. What does the phrase 'wait for the Lord' mean? What different meanings of wait might be appropriate here? What are your experiences of these meanings?
- 9. What simple practical practices do you have that help you spend time with God? How do you 'protect' these practices from the distractions of life?
- 10. What practices are individual for you? What corporate practices do you engage in? Why are these corporate practices important?

Prayer points:

- Continue to pray for the situation in Israel/Palestine and in the Ukraine, and the people affected by these conflicts.
- Pray for the people of Papua New Guinea.
