- 1. How would you describe the disciples' faith at this point in time?
- 2. What was Jesus' first words to them? Why do you think he said this?
- 3. What larger theological point do these words have? Why do you think this is significant?
- 4. Where does verse 21 tell us mission starts? Why is it crucial for us to remember this?
- 5. "Mission is finding out what God is doing and joining in." What do you think of this statement? How are you joining in?
- 6. What does such a mission require from us? What sort of faith is needed for such a task?
- 7. What gift does Jesus offer? What role does this gift play in growing and strengthening our faith?
- 8. What missional step of faith is God calling you to make? How will you do this?
- 9. How does God's call to Abram resonate with the calling Jesus issues to his disciples (and us) here?
- 10. What does it mean for you to be sent to others at this time? Who and where are your 'others'?

- Pray for the plight of refugees, the homeless, and the displaced around the world.
- Pray for the two families from Afghanistan here.
- Pray for those affected by violence and conflict and climate change around the globe.
