# Read John 1:29-42

- 1. "Evangelism is a community activity." What does this statement mean to you? Do you agree or disagree? Why?
- 2. In what way does this passage illustrate the idea of evangelism as a community activity?
- 3. "An **alternative** community that is **attractive** and then earns the right to **articulate** (speak)." Spend some time discussing this statement. What does it mean? In what way is it a good alternative way of thinking about evangelism?
- 4. What is important about the three words in bold in the above statement? How are these words illustrated in the passage in John?

### Read John 4:21-30

- 5. How did Jesus talk to the Samaritan woman? How did Jesus share authentically with her?
- 6. Why do you think Jesus shared with her what he did? Was it different to what he had shared with others? Why?
- 7. How can we make sure that we talk to people **authentically**, rather than coming with an **agenda**? Why can coming with an agenda be harmful?
- 8. "If we are serious about the great commission, but are not serious about the great commandment, then we are just making a great commotion." Brian McLaren

Do you agree? How does evangelism suffer if we forget the great commandment?

#### Read John 15:1-5, 17-19, 26-27

- 9. If evangelism is about helping others come to know God, what part does God himself play?
- 10. How do we **abide** in God? How can we help each other, as a community, do this?
