- 4. What does it mean to 'sin and fall short of the glory of God'?
- 5. How are we all the same? What do we all have in common?
- 6. What images does Paul use in this passage? What point do they make about what God has done in Christ?
- 7. What does justification mean? What does atonement mean? What is Paul saying about these two concepts here?
- 8. Why was Jesus the sacrifice of atonement? What connection does this have with the Law?
- 9. Why does God redeem us? What are his reasons for doing this? What were the possible alternatives if he didn't?
- 10. What is the central importance of faith in Jesus? What does this faith actually look like?
- 11. What is our response to what God has done for us?
