- 4. What was Belshazzar basing his life and decisions on?
- 5. What parallels are there between Belshazzar's actions and motivations and our society today?
- 6. Why did Daniel turn down the gifts of office? What does this tell us?
- 7. What does this passage tell us about God's judgement? How does this episode relate to the idea that we will all eventually be judged?
- 8. How do our choices matter? How do you live differently knowing that each decision can have huge ramifications in our world?
- 9. "Life in the middle is not life to the full." What do you think of this statement? What does a life in the middle look like?
- 10. How do we avoid living "live in the middle"?
- 11. How can we ensure we are allowing Jesus to direct the choices we make?
- 12. How do we make sure we are living a live of wisdom and humility like Daniel did?
