Read John 11:1-44

- 1. Why did Jesus not go to Lazarus immediately? What do you think Jesus was thinking?
- 2. How did Jesus react when he got there? Why?
- 3. What do you think of what Mary and Martha each said to Jesus? What similarities are there? What differences? What do you think this means?
- 4. What previous experiences of praying for healing do you have? How were they answered?
- 5. In what circumstances of life do you find it harder to see God's control?
- 6. How is what happened to Lazarus an example of healing? How is it not?
- 7. How do we experience renewal and healing in those times when our prayers for healing are not answered?
- 8. What has your experience of praying for healing and restoration brought you to believe about Jesus? Why?
- 9. When our prayers are not answered the way we would like, how should we react? What do such answers mean?
- 10. "God's timing is not our timing." What do you think of this statement? How does this fit with your view of God and of healing?
- 11. Read Romans 12:12. What does living this verse actually look like? How does God help us in moments of pain and grief?

Prayer points:

- Spend time praying for the situation in Israel/Palestine and the people affected by the conflict.
- Pray for healing and restoration for those who are ill at this time.
