- 4. How is God described in this passage? What words are used to refer to him?
- 5. What does this passage tell us about God's faithfulness its content and its timing?
- 6. When have you most needed hope in your life? How did God respond?
- 7. What are you hopeful for at the moment? What hope do you see growing around you?
- 8. What is the 'new thing' God is wanting to do in your life/church/community? How might you contribute to what he wants to do?
- 9. How can you offer hope to others in need?

Prayer points:

- Pray for a greater revelation of God's Spirit in your life.
- Pray for the people of Afghanistan and Pakistan after the devasting earthquake last week, and also for the people of Sri Lanka.
- Pray for the ill and vulnerable in our communities.
- Pray for those affected by violence and conflict around the globe.
