Read Matthew 13:1-23

- 1. In this parable: who is the sower? What do the seeds represent? What do the various types of land represent?
- 2. What is the main point Jesus is trying to get across in this parable?
- 3. Do you think the crowd understood what Jesus was trying to say to them? Why or why not?
- 4. Why did the disciples ask Jesus about his use of parables?
- 5. What are the general rules for interpreting parables? What are we supposed to look for? How accurate to the "real thing" is the teaching?
- 6. What are the thorns in your life? Where is the rocky ground in your life?
- 7. How do we make sure our "soil" is receptive to what God is saying and doing?
- 8. Jesus said, "Whoever has ears, let them hear." How can we be sure to hear what Jesus is saving?
- 9. Why did Jesus say he taught in parables? What does this tell us about the truths of the kingdom?
- 10. What would be the equivalent of this today?
- 11. Why do you think Jesus gave an interpretation of this parable?
- 12. What are the dangers Jesus highlights in his interpretation? How do we avoid these dangers?
