- 4. What was the devil offering Jesus? What was wrong with what he was asking Jesus to do?
- 5. What was the devil trying to prove? What was he trying to get Jesus to do? Why?
- 6. How did Jesus respond to the devil?
- 7. What other 'wilderness times' do you think Jesus experienced? What was the result of these times?
- 8. What God-initiated wilderness times have you had? How did God get your attention?
- 9. How have these experiences reminded you of who you are and of who God is?
- 10. What will you be mindful of next time you experience a time in the wilderness? What has this series – and previous wilderness experiences – reminded you of for next time?
