- 2. What reasons for not going/fears might Abram have had over God's call?
- 3. What fears do you have about God's call on your life? Why?
- 4. If Abram doesn't go, what is different? What doesn't happen?

## **Read Genesis 16**

- 5. When have you had to wait a long time for God's promise to come to pass? How did you cope? What made it hard? What helped you persevere in hope?
- 6. Why did Sarah suggest Abraham sleep with Hagar? What was Sarah trying to achieve through this?
- 7. What were the short-term results of this? What longer term implications and results did this have?
- 8. Have you ever, like Sarah, tried to speed up the fulfilment of God's promise to you? How did you attempt this? What happened?
- 9. Looking at your life, where do you see God moving to fulfil his promises where perhaps, at the time, you didn't? What changed your perspective?
- 10. What new things has God done in your life that have led to others hearing the good news about Jesus?
- 11. What new thing, what uncertain thing is God asking you to lean into and trust him over at the moment?
