- 4. How can we better allow God's law to be on our minds and heart? Is there anything we can do to make this process easier?
- 5. Can God literally forget our sins? What is required for this to happen?
- 6. What does it mean that we can enter the holy place? What does this change for us?
- 7. How can we better hold fast our hope without wavering? What is the reason given in this passage for why we should do this?
- 8. How do we make sure our 'body language' matches what we believe?
- 9. Do you spend time considering how to help other believers grow? What can you do to help them?
- 10. What is the danger if we do not meet with each other? What are the benefits of meeting with each other?
- 11. How is our meeting together important for what God wants to do in his world?
- 12. What does this verse say we should be doing when we meet?

- Pray for the two families from Afghanistan that are heading to us.
- Pray for those affected by violence and conflict around the globe, particularly Sudan.
