- 6. "Faith is not afraid of questions." Is this true for you? What are the major questions of faith you have had? How has your faith grown as a consequence?
- 7. What has your faith allowed to see/experience that you wouldn't have otherwise?
- 8. How does this expand/reinforce your faith?
- 9. Why is there a connection between faith and pleasing God? What does a 'pleasing' faith look like?
- 10. How is faith relational? Why is faith relational?
- 11. What biblical/historical/personal faith stories inspire you? Why?
- 12. What do you need to ask God for regarding your faith at the moment?
