Community Group Service

esus said that He came not to be served but to serve others (Mark 10:45). This is a great reminder for us that service must be a regular part of our groups' lives, as we seek to live as the body of Christ in the world. That is why April and May are service months for Community Groups. Please engage in one service event as a group in the next couple of months.

Why Your Group Should Serve Together*

- **1. IT'S BONDING** By serving together, you create shared memories and experiences that you celebrate (and even laugh about).
- **2. IT'S BIBLICAL** Groups that show concern for those in need emulate the ministry of Jesus.
- **3. IT'S STRENGTHENING** Serving strengthens everyone as you step outside your comfort zones and learn to help others.
- 4. IT'S BENEFICIAL Groups that mix up the format of the groups stay healthier longer.

Plan an Excellent Group Serving Opportunity*

- **1. SET THE EXPECTATIONS** Answer the following questions ahead of time. What type of service? Who will be involved? Where will we go? Will you meet and ride together, or just meet at the location? What time will you meet? When will you be finished?
- **2. INVOLVE EVERYONE** Make sure everyone has a chance to participate as their gifts and abilities allow.
- **3. LOOK FOR A FIT** With the time allowed and the abilities represented in the group, what are the opportunities available? If everyone is "all thumbs," helping build a Habitat for Humanity House is out but sorting donations at Salvation Army might be perfect.
- **4. BE FLEXIBLE** Things often change or differ from original expectations. Lead the group in accepting those changes with grace.
- **5. PRAY** Circle up with your group and pray before you begin your service.
- **6. CELEBRATE TOGETHER** Go out for dinner or coffee after the opportunity is over to celebrate the time of service. Alternatively, celebrate and debrief during your next group meeting.

Many of the students ice skated for the first time, as Calvary participants gave them skating tips and assisted them on the ice. Everyone had a blast and shared lots of laughs in the process. After skating, students and Calvary participants arrived at Calvary to warm up and participate in "Minute to Win it" games. People of all ages were competing to complete some of the most difficult and ridiculous challenges in under



a minute. Both American and International friends gathered around the players and cheered them on.

Later in the evening, we enjoyed a delicious meal of chili with the students. This was a wonderful time to share fun memories of our day with each other, as well as learn more about everyone's culture. One of the tables of participants spoke over 20 different languages collectively! The students were so thank-ful for the opportunity to get away from their studies and have a fun evening with new friends. Studies show that a high percentage of international students who come to the United States do not enter an American home while they are here. Showing our international students hospitality in this way not only cultivates friendship but also is a direct way to show them the love of Christ and love them well. UPDATE ON RICK AND DEBBIE BARDIN CAMEROON, AFRICA

e were blessed last month by the visit of Dr. Rick and Debbie Bardin, who serve at Mbingo Baptist Hospital (MBH) in the mainly English-speaking



area of Cameroon, Africa. MBH is associated with the Cameroon Baptist Convention, part of the origin of which was influenced by North American Baptist missionary work generations ago.

At the Sunday luncheon, we learned that MBH is not a little hut in the African jungle. Among other amenities, it has: diagnostic equipment, including a CT scanner and electronic medical records; specialty training in internal medicine and in pathology; a telepathology system for scanning microscope slides that can be emailed to other pathologists (even in the USA) for shared viewing and interpretation. They still use and greatly appreciate the bandages that are rolled and sent through the NAB White Cross Ministry, in which our "Helping Hands" group at Calvary participates. Another missionary close to our hearts, Dr. Julie Stone, is currently assisting them, due to unsafe conditions at Banso Baptist Hospital where she normally serves. You will find informative videos at nabonmission.org.

Rick and Debbie support the Christian Internal Medicine Specialization (CIMS) program. Rick is training doctors and has established a well-respected

pathology service that not only supports the hospital's surgical program, but is also used by other hospitals in Cameroon. A current prayer request is the success and continued funding of Dr. Mbanga who is in a three-year pathology residency in Kenya and is expected to return to MBH at its completion. Pray for Dr. Mbanga and his family.

Debbie serves in the hospital's HIV clinic where she counsels patients and shares the truth of the Gospel. One unique avenue is the Scripture Card Ministry. To the best of her ability, every day, every patient at the hospital gets a small card with a Bible verse on it. This encourages the patients and opens avenues for witness.

Debbie is active with the Women In Service (WINS) group. One of the service projects that they did this year was a blessing to four families who were affected by the burning of houses during the "civil war" that has been going on in Cameroon.

There has been much violence and unrest in Cameroon for the past several years. So far, MBH has not been specifically targeted, but certainly has been affected. Rick and Debbie shared some specifics during our worship service. Keep Cameroon, the Christians, the unsaved, the hospital staff, and the patients in your prayers.

As the Bardins have learned, God alone is faithful and remains unchanging in an ever-changing world.

MERCY MINISTRIES FOCUS FOR MARCH: HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS

Sex trafficking is human trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation, including sexual slavery. A victim is forced, in one of a variety of ways, into a situation of dependency on their trafficker(s) and then used by them to give sexual services to customers. Sex trafficking is one of the biggest criminal businesses in the world.

Locations where this practice occurs span the globe and reflect an intricate web between nations, making it very difficult to construct viable solutions to this human-rights problem. It can happen in any community and victims can be any age, race, gender, or nationality. Language barriers, fear of their traffickers, and/or fear of law enforcement frequently keep victims from seeking help, making human trafficking a hidden crime.

Facts about Human Trafficking:

- There are an estimated 20.9 million victims of human trafficking globally. (2012, International Labor Organization)
- Sex trafficking makes about \$99 billion a year.
 (2014, International Labor Organization Report)
- The majority of trafficking victims identified by states are women and children who make up 88% of all victims (66% of victims are women, 13% girls, 9% boys, and 12% men). (United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime's Global Report on Trafficking in Persons (2016)

SO, WHAT IS GOD DOING IN THE LEHIGH VALLEY TO RESCUE THOSE ENSLAVED UNDER THIS EVIL?

He is working through the ministry of *Truth Home*, a therapeutic residential home offering dramatically changed lives and hope-filled futures to survivors of sex trafficking and sexual exploitation.

ANGRY? WHO, ME?

Why is it that angry people always seem to be the last to know they're angry?



- Since angry people are confident in their right-ness, over time their blindness increases, reinforcing their delusion that they've set the world aright.
 - Stubborn pride is at the root of sinful anger (Proverbs 16:18, 14:29; James 4:1-4; Matthew 7:5; 1 John 2:11)
- When those close to angry people are either too afraid to confront or prior attempts have failed, the angry person goes largely unchecked.
 - Jesus calls and empowers us to lovingly confront sin (Ephesians 4:15; Proverbs 15:18; Matthew 18:15-17; Galatians 6:1)
- Righteous anger can quickly turn sinful.
 - While not all anger is sinful, true righteous indignation occupies only a small fraction of our anger. (Ephesians 4:26-27; James 1:19-20)
- Anger can be sneaky. (Jeremiah 17:9)

Sinful anger's rainbow of intensities:

- Indifference to reparable wrongs
- Avoidance of conflict
- Defensive withdrawal
- Judgmental thoughts
- Quiet brooding
- Complaining
- Critical attitude
- Irritable
- Argumentative
- Bickering
- Volatile
- Explosive
- Abusive

Anger is an emotional response to a perceived wrong. Key word: perceived. As sinners, we're prone to wrong judgments, and blind to our pridefueled reactions. Think about what typically angers you. Is it when you perceive you've been personally offended? Consider when Jesus was wronged. Interestingly, Scripture never records Jesus being angry when He was personally offended; it was always in response to wrongs against others. While we shouldn't always remain silent when wronged, we do need God's wisdom to respond wisely. We also need wisdom to recognize those times we should be angry when we're not.

So, do **you** struggle with anger? Yes, we all do. Does that answer anger you? Confess that to Jesus. Christ bore God's wrath for your anger and promises to help you grow in humility, grace, and forgiveness.


From the movie, *Overcomer*, by the Kendrick brothers, Chris Fabry wrote the novel <u>Overcomer</u>. What do you allow to define you?
