RICK AND DEBBIE BARDIN MBINGO BAPTIST HOSPITAL CAMEROON, AFRICA

r. Rick and Debbie
Bardin serve at Mbingo
Baptist Hospital (MBH)
in the mainly English-speaking
area of Cameroon, Africa. MBH is
associated with the Cameroon



Baptist Convention, part of the origin of which was influenced by North American Baptist missionary work generations ago.

MBH is not a little hut in the African jungle. Among other amenities, it has diagnostic equipment, including a CT scanner; electronic medical records; specialty training in internal medicine and in pathology (CIMS/PAACS); a telepathology system for scanning microscope slides that can be emailed to other pathologists for shared viewing and interpretation. However, they still use, and greatly appreciate, the bandages that are rolled and sent through the NAB White Cross ministry. Our "Helping Hands" group here at Calvary helps with this.

Rick and Debbie support the Christian Internal Medicine Specialization (CIMS) program. Rick is training doctors and has established a well-respected pathology service that not only supports the hospital's surgical program, but is also used by other hospitals in Cameroon. A current prayer request is the success and continued funding of Dr. Mbanga who is in his first year of a 3-year pathology

residency in Kenya and is expected to return to MBH at its completion.

Debbie serves in the hospital's HIV clinic where she counsels patients and shares the truth of the Gospel. One unique avenue is the Scripture Card ministry. To the best of her ability, every day every patient at the hospital gets a small card with a Bible verse on it. This encourages the patients and opens avenues for witness.

Debbie is active with the Women In Service (WINS) group. One of the service projects that they did this year blessed four families who were affected by the burning of houses during the serious conflict that has been going on in Cameroon.

There has been much violence and unrest in Cameroon for several years. So far, MBH has not been specifically targeted but certainly has been affected. Patients and volunteers had difficulty getting to the facility or were afraid to travel there. Keep Cameroon, the Christians, the unsaved, the hospital staff, and the patients in your prayers.

As the Bardins have learned, God alone is faithful and remains unchanging in an ever-changing world. "He is the Rock, His works are perfect, and all His ways are just. A faithful God who does no wrong, upright and just is He" (Deuteronomy 32:4).



BRIGHTCOURSE CLIENT TESTIMONY

During the month of October, Bright Hope was participating in a trial run of a new curriculum for our medical clinics called BrightCourse. This current, live-streaming curriculum allows Bright Hope to offer engaging and relevant curriculum on topics such as prenatal care, pregnancy, healthy relationships and life skills straight from a laptop or smartphone. The Easton Center received a call from a faithful client who was put on bedrest due to some complications in her pregnancy and said she was going to have to cancel her appointment. This client is a first-time mom and really looks forward to her appointments every week to learn all she can about caring for her baby and herself as a new mom. Fortunately, BrightCourse allows Bright Hope to text a lesson straight to a client's phone in these special circumstances. The staff and volunteers at the Easton Center were so excited to be able to participate in a remote appointment with this client as her advocate engaged with her over the phone while they both watched the same

educational video in two different locations. The client was so grateful and encouraged to receive that type of compassionate care while being confined to her bed. It was this successful remote client appointment that solidified in our minds that Bright Hope needs to move forward with offering BrightCourse to all of our clients in 2020.

CHRISTMAS FOOD COLLECTION & DISTRIBUTION UPDATE

"Thank you very much, and God bless you. We really needed it." What one family said was echoed echoed over and over as people picked up their food from our Christmas Distribution or had their food delivered. We gave out about 220 bags this year, and it was all very well received. Thank you to all those who helped in any way: donating food, time, resources, or all three! A recent article in the Morning Call informed us that 38% of families in the Lehigh Valley are financially insecure; this often translates into not enough food. Through our Christmas Distribution, each family received 3+ bags of groceries, thanks to the generosity of the Calvary family, an incredible donation of 100 hams from Light of Christ Church, the great set-up and support of Templo el Refugio and Casa Refugio, Dick Moatz's work collecting baked goods from Giant throughout the week, and a bounty of extra food (spinach, cabbage, bananas, coffee, and more) from Second Harvest Food Bank, plus all the adorable stuffed animals that were donated. Again this year, we became the hands and feet of Christ and made a real, practical difference in the lives of these families.

A Won't You Be <mark>My</mark> ^ Neighbor?

"A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood" is more than a movie about Mister Fred Rogers. It's one that turns the camera on you, the viewer. That's because Mister Rogers, who's being interviewed by a journalist, keeps turning the interview around. Clearly, Mister Rogers is on a mission. He perceives the journalist's woundedness and sets out to enter into a relationship with him.

Intentionality seemed to characterize Mister Rogers' relationships. Though not overtly Christian in his message, the Gospel seemed to shape the way he treated everyone because he saw everyone the same: they were his neighbors.

Jesus spoke about neighbors in surprising ways. In Luke 10:25-37, a lawyer asked Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus, as He often did, answered by asking another question: "What is written in the law?" The man answered: love God and love your neighbor. He then asks, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus again answers with a question. But first, He tells the parable of the Good Samaritan.

"Which of these three," Jesus asked, "proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" The lawyer answered rightly, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus concurred. "Go, and do likewise."

Notice how Jesus turns the question around from "Who is my neighbor" to "Who was a neighbor to this half-dead man?" Like the movie, Jesus turns the camera on us: "Are you a neighbor to those in need?"

Someone defined neighbor this way: "A neighbor is not an object one defines, but a relationship into which one enters." That is the Gospel. Jesus proved to be the ultimate neighbor. In our sin, we were like the man left for dead. Jesus saw our need and had compassion on us. He was intentional in pursuing us. He rescued us, bound up our wounds, set us free from sin, and restored our relationship with God. And how should we respond to such mercy? "Go, and do likewise."

- 3. The *emphasis will be on Bible study* and mentorship, while Wednesday Night's focus is on community and fellowship.






The 2019 - 2020 Budget is \$2,375,010 and is divided evenly making each month's goal \$197,918 rather than being weighted differently throughout the year.
