

Encouraging Service Within Your Community Group

he Apostle Paul taught that the Church is built up more into the image of Christ as each person serves in the body (1 Corinthians 12; Ephesians 4:15-16). Serving in our Community Groups is a great way to discover, develop and deploy the gifts God has given us within our church family. Here is a simple process for beginning to do this in your group.

FIRST, read 1 Corinthians 12:7, Ephesians 4:11-16, and Romans 12:3-8 as a group and discuss the importance of each person serving within the group.

SECOND, read through the table below and have group members begin praying about the ways that God might be prompting them to serve within the group.

Host the group	Organize prayer partners within the group, provide follow-up to ensure prayer partners are connecting, and provide tips for being effective prayer partners		
Organize childcare and children's participation in the group	Organize a system or rotation for members to provide food and beverages for the group gatherings		
Lead the teaching time (you must be a member of Calvary and a CG leader must oversee the teaching)	Keep track of and follow up with prayer requests and personal struggles		
Lead the prayer time	Lead a men's bi-weekly discipleship group		
Record group prayer requests and communicating those requests to the group via email	Lead a women's bi-weekly discipleship group		
Organize a fellowship event at least once/year	Contact those who miss group gatherings to see how they are doing		
Organize a service event at least once/year	Lead the icebreaker portion of the group		
Organize an outreach event at least once/year	Additional suggestions from group members		

THIRD, at your next gathering, have group members discuss the ways in which God has been directing them to serve in any of the areas mentioned or in a way that isn't on the list.

veryone has a story to tell – what's yours?
Do you see a coherent theme in your story
with a final resolution or purpose? Many
people react to life as it happens, with no clarifying
vision that unifies everything. What if you expand
your vision? You do not have an independent story
that occasionally interacts with others, but rather a
scene in a larger story.

This is the Lord's story. He is Creator and Redeemer and the point of the story is His Glory. We are bit players who come on and off stage as the scenes change. Our role is to take our cues from the Lord, to reflect and highlight His glory as His imagebearers, and leave the stage.

This means that our lives must be viewed from this perspective. All of our joys and trials, successes and

failures, pleasures and sufferings make sense only from the view of the entire story. But this is precisely the view we don't have from within our scene. God must tell us how the pieces fit together – and He has, in His Word. But even there we have only an outline of things to come, not the full script. For instance, Romans 8:18 encourages our hearts without providing details:

"For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us."

Without revealing such glory in all its detail, the Lord encourages us to endure, because something far greater awaits.

As you learn the plot of the Lord's story and get to know the main characters, you will become wise as you encounter new elements. We benefit from pastors and teachers who are skilled at orienting us within the story, that we might be faithful no matter what twist or turn comes to our scene. When the final curtain falls, will your scene be one that reflects His mercy, grace, and goodness in redeeming you, or will yours be one that reflects His right judgment against rebellion?

Of one thing I am perfectly sure, God's story never ends with ashes.






Because He Loves Me: How Christ transforms Our Daily Life (#242) by Elyse Fitzpatrick: "...if you neglect to focus on God's love for you in


