Acts 22:30-21:11

Verse 30 - The Roman tribune isn't willing to give up on what, according to this verse? What does this give Paul another crack at doing?

Chapter 23:1 - Why does Paul bring up his conscience? What's he trying to convince them of? Did being arrested, bound and almost beaten cause Paul to give up? Notice how he still seems to care about them regarding salvation in Jesus, why is he this way?

Verse 2 - Why did the High Priest have Paul struck?

Verse 3 - What is Paul calling Ananias here? Is he correct?

Verse 4 - Who is Ananias?

Verse 5 - Notice how Paul responds here? What can we learn from this, even in our Christian lives today? What would have Paul been defending if he had refused to admit his wrong? Is it the same for us?

Verse 6-7 - How does Paul clarify his point in this verse, why is this an interesting move? What is he appealing to here and why is it so powerful?

From the specific to the general (rhetorically inductive)? How does this rhetorical inductive move benefit him and the Gospel proclamation?
Why were they divided?

Verse 8 - Why is this information important from Luke about the distinction between the two groups within Judaism?

Verse 9 - Why the sudden shift in viewpoint by the Pharisees?

Verse 10 - What ends up happening again to Paul?

Verse 11 - How does this verse sum up the entirety of the worldview or paradigm the apostle Paul lives by? How can it be also a blessing to us?
