¹On August 29 of the second year of King Darius's reign, the Lord gave a message through the prophet Haggai to Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Jeshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest.

² This is what the Lord of Heaven's Armies says: The people are saying, "The time has not yet come to rebuild the house of the Lord."

Then the Lord sent this message through the prophet Haggai: "Why are you living in luxurious houses while My house lies in ruins?"

⁵ This is what the Lord of Heaven's Armies says: "Look at what's happening to you! ⁶ You have planted much but harvest little. You eat but are not satisfied.

"You drink but are still thirsty. You put on clothes but cannot keep warm. Your wages disappear as though you were putting them in pockets filled with holes!"

⁷This is what the Lord of Heaven's Armies says: "Look at what's happening to you! ⁸ Now go up into the hills, bring down timber, and rebuild My house.

"Then I will take pleasure in it and be honored," says the Lord. "You hoped for rich harvests, but they were poor. And when you brought your harvest home, I blew it away.

"Why? Because My house lies in ruins," says the Lord of Heaven's Armies, "while all of you are busy building your own fine houses. ¹⁰ It's because of you that the heavens withhold the dew and the earth produces no crops.

"I have called for a drought on your fields and hills — a drought to wither the grain and grapes and olive trees and all your other crops, a drought to starve you and your livestock and to ruin everything you have worked so hard to get."

"These people say, 'The time has not yet come to rebuild the house of the LORD." Haggai 1:2

Watch out for the drift into misaligned priorities (and complacency, apathy).

"Is this a time to live in your paneled houses, while My house lies in ruins?" Haggai 1:4

Financial priority #1: generosity toward God and His mission.

Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops. Proverbs 3:9

You have sown much and harvested little. You eat, but you never have enough; you drink, but you never have your fill. You clothe yourselves, but no one is warm. And he who earns wages does so to put them into a bag with holes. Haggai 1:6

God has the right to bring frustration into our lives to get our attention and call us back to right priorities.

Haggai 1:1 On the first day of the sixth month (August 29) the Word of the Lord came to Haggai.

Haggai 1:15 On the twenty-fourth day of the six month (September 21) the people responded and started building the temple.
