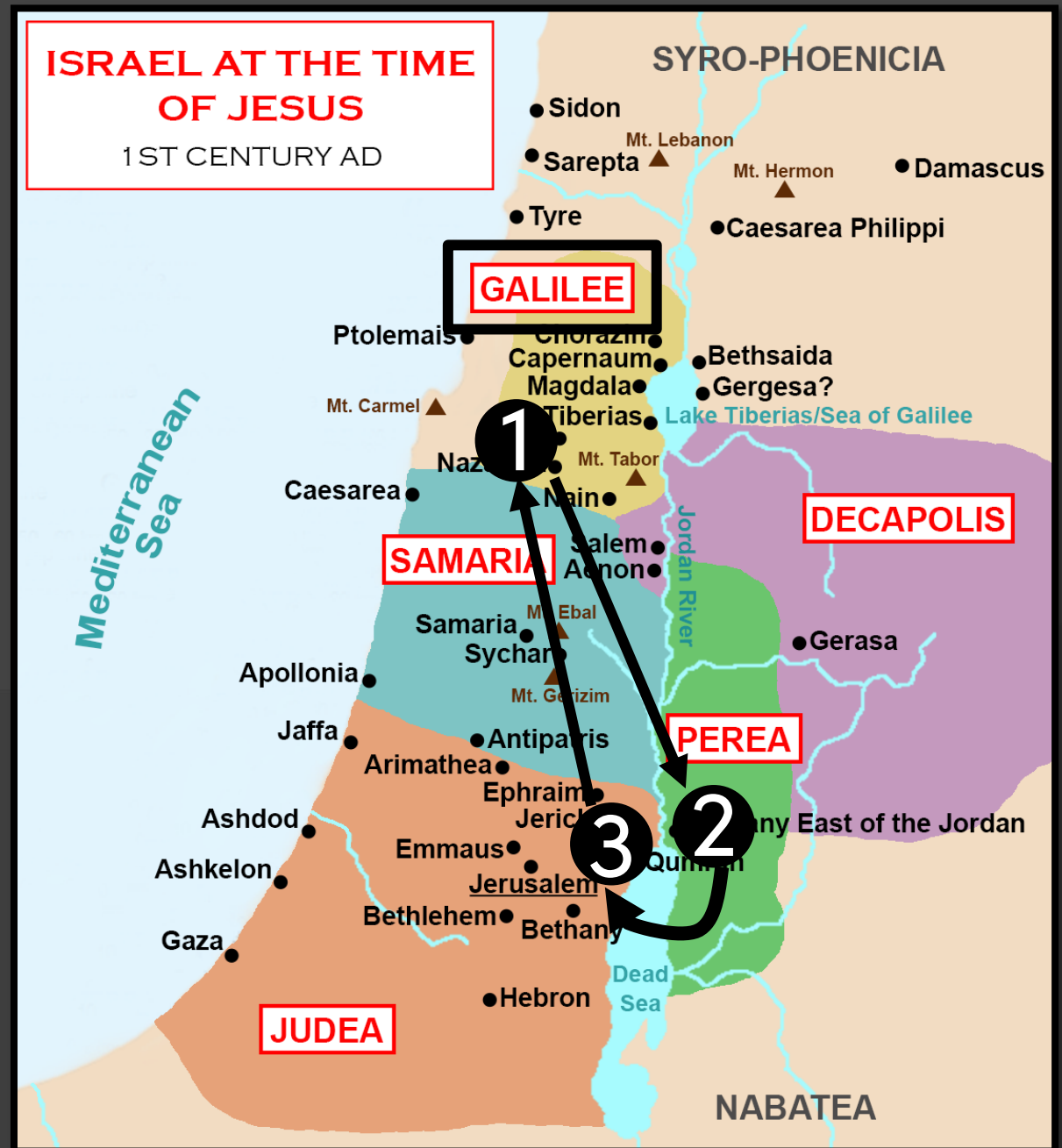

More teaching – not record

- 23-27: **More teaching**
