





On Sundays and Wednesdays, we don't have any open classrooms for additional LifeGroups, Sunday School classes, or special events to start meeting.




KITCHEN EXPANSION

YOUR GIVING JOURNEY



INITIAL GIVER 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

An Initial Giver is someone who decides to give for the first time out of a response to God's Word. This person decides to give and trust God and the leaders of the church with this gift.

CONSISTENT GIVER 2 Corinthians 9:6-8

A Consistent Giver decides to give and do it consistently to exercise the discipline of giving. This is often done online through automatic recurring gifts, but it doesn't have to be!



PRIORITY GIVER Luke 14:28-35

An Priority Giver places such a significant priority on their giving that it drives their spending and their saving, as opposed to their spending and saving driving their giving.



SURRENDERED GIVER Colossians 1:15-18, 22-23

A Surrendered Giver seeks to honor God with 100% of their resources. They give in a way that changes them, in a way that reflects that everything they have belongs to God.



ETERNAL GIVER 1 Timothy 6:6-19

An Eternal Giver makes decisions in the short term that have longer term effects on their generosity. They think of what home to buy, what car to purchase, and how much to save all in relation to their generosity capacity.



It's possible you've been a part of church campaigns in the past where you were asked to give "above and beyond" your regular giving. In fact, we've done that as part of our Harvest Project and Greater Things campaigns that allowed us to build our Worship Center a few years ago.

Since then, we've found that "over and above" giving is potentially confusing to people who don't have a baseline for their "normal giving." It also has the potential to diminish the significance of the ongoing generosity and current ministries making an impact at First MB.

The Forward campaign will last two years. In those two years, every gift given will go to the Forward campaign to help fund our **mission** (our general budget) and our **multiplication** (the building project).

Week 1 | Irrational (Rational) Giving

OVERVIEW: (2 Corinthians 8:1-7)

The Apostle Paul writes in this passage about the grace given to the churches at Macedonia (which were three different churches – Thessalonica, Philippi, and Berea), as they gave generously – even **out of their poverty.**

This passage is so profound because it illustrates not only a church giving entirely of their own accord, TO another church (the church across the sea in Jerusalem) whom they would more than likely never see nor meet; but it also illustrates the ability of a church in extreme poverty and affliction to give generously – even beyond their means – with overwhelming joy.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1)	What is	significant	about tl	ne way	in whi	ch the	Maced	lonian

2) What does it mean that the Macedonian churches gave themselves "first to the Lord" as they gave?

3) Have you ever spent significant time with the Lord prior to making a decision about your giving?

4) The realities and pressures of life and financial strain often try to hinder us from truly giving ourselves to the Lord before we decide how and what to give. How can you guard yourself against this?
5) If you are truly honest, does your giving drive your spending and your saving; or does your spending and saving drive your giving? Why is this so?
6) What would have to be different in your life if your giving drove all of your other decisions? How would this change your perspective and your other financial decisions?
7) Paul makes a specific point about excelling in this grace of giving (verse 7), just as we excel in other areas of our faith as well. Why do you think he felt the need to single-out giving like this and to utilize other areas of our faith to "persuade" the Corinthian church to give

in this way? Why is giving such a particularly difficult – and sometimes

even polarizing - part of our faith? How can we overcome this?

Week 2 | Genuine Love is Financially Generous

OVERVIEW: (2 Corinthians 8:8-15)

The Apostle Paul obviously desires that the church at Corinth will contribute to relief of the Jerusalem church. But he doesn't just care that they give. He cares even more *why* they give. He could easily say, "You made a commitment. I was counting on it. Follow through!" But he doesn't say that. Instead, he works very hard to free them from bad motivations for giving. "I say this not as a command..." (verse 8). He wants them to be free from guilt, duty, obligation, pressure, and everything else as they give.

- 1) What are some of the trappings of giving that we often fall into as Christ followers? Another way of asking this might be, what are some of the lies we believe about giving to the local church?
- 2) What are some of the key truths the Apostle Paul is saying to us about giving in this passage?
- 3) Paul reminds us in verse 9 about what our Lord and Savior did for us and the incredible debt we could never (and are not being asked to) repay. How does this remembrance of what Christ did for us affect how you give? Would you say you give in a way that is driven by the gospel? Or is it driven by other things?

4) Paul reminds the Corinthians of their prior desire to give as he
encourages them to yet again do so. Do you find your willingness to
give ebbing and flowing with the seasons of your life? Why is this so?
And how might this be different if you were to base your desire to
give on things other than your circumstances and ability?

5) Verse 12 is a powerful reminder that we are not being asked to give what we don't have. We are being asked to give, however, from what we do have. We often make excuses of why we don't give, stating, "Well, if I made more money or had more margin, then I would give." But God knows your situation; He is the one who gave it to you. So let us ask ourselves a convicting question: If you were God, would you give you more money?

Week 3 | Eagerness

OVERVIEW: (2 Corinthians 8:16-24)

In this passage the Apostle Paul writes about how passionate and trustworthy those who are going to be aiding in the collection and carrying of the offering are, which are Titus and the "two [unnamed] brothers." Paul is seeking to convey to these early believers that these men are not only trustworthy but are passionate as well and should not be let down as the offering is received. While our giving is to be done to God and not to man, it is important to note that Paul felt it necessary to mention the credibility of these men as to further compel these believers to give without reservation and in full joy.

- 1) What are your observations about the passion described of Paul, Titus, and the "two brothers" who were aiding in the collection and carrying of the offering in this passage? How does this affect you as you think about your own desire to give?
- 2) Have you ever let your questions about the local church hinder your generosity to God?
- 3) What role does trust play into your generosity both trust in God as well as trust in the leaders whom God has put in place at First MB? Is this an area of growth for you, or would you say you might be someone who could help others along in this area?

4) What does it mean that Paul, Titus, and the two "brothers" had an eagerness to serve in this offering collection?
5) Would you call your desire to give "eager"? And would anyone ever call upon you to be one of those who will help receive and carry the collection for the Lord? If not, what hinders your eagerness, and how does God desire for you to change?
6) As you think about the Forward initiative and this next season for First MB, what causes you to be "eager" about this new day ahead?

Week 4 | Cheerful Generosity

OVERVIEW: (2 Corinthians 9:1-9)

The Apostle Paul speaks here once again about the importance of the heart behind the gift. He not only expresses that he hopes the Corinthians do not let him down in what they had previously been eager to do in their giving but that also they don't rise to the occasion merely out of obligation or duty (or because he is saying to do so) but rather because of genuine joy in generosity. He also is careful (verse 4) to ensure the Corinthians know he would never speak ill of them to the Macedonians but rather that he would put it on himself for being incorrect about their generous gift. Paul's transparency in this passage is inspiring as he vulnerably shares with these believers his heart in desiring them to give. He reiterates his heart behind the matter in the well-known words of verses 6-9, just in case there were any questions about the true nature of what he is asking them to do.

- 1) Most people genuinely do desire to be generous; that's typically not the challenging issue. More often the challenging issue is giving of ourselves in a way that erodes selfishness and replenishes generosity. In what ways do you feel your selfishness still creeping in occasionally as it relates to your generosity? What might you do in order to combat that?
- 2) Have you ever promised something to someone that you feel you can't fulfill? How did that make you feel, and why did you feel that way?

3) Does guilt or shame ever play into your mind as you consider what
to give? Is it playing into your mind as you consider this Forward
season currently? Be as transparent as you can with your LifeGroup,
as they seek to support you in prayer, grace, and release from
obligation and compulsion - as the Apostle Paul invites.

4) Paul desires for these early believers to truly enjoy the fruit of their contribution. Take some time to discuss and "enjoy" the possibilities of what is to come in this next season of ministry at First MB with our "New Day." What excites you about the future of First MB?

5) When you enjoy a "harvest of righteousness," how does that affect your heart and desire towards giving? How might your heart be more oriented towards the future as opposed to the past as it relates to your giving to God's mission?

Week 5 | The Ripple Effect of Generosity

OVERVIEW: (2 Corinthians 9:10-15)

In this passage the Apostle Paul speaks about the multiplicative effect of generosity and how our giving is not only about those we will give TO but also about the heart in which we give FROM. Paul encourages us to give generously, sharing that other people see God as we give. In essence, Paul is saying, "Generosity doesn't just *fund* the mission; it is the mission."

- 1) Read verse 11 and ask yourself this question: If the purpose of us having resources is so that we can give them away, would you call yourself a "good steward" of what God has given you? Why or why not?
- 2) Verses 12 and 13 speak of the evangelistic effect of generosity. As you consider your commitment to the Forward campaign, are you giving in such a way that will create a witness and draw more people to God as they hear your story? What might that look like for you?
- 3) As referenced in the prior question, verse 13 speaks to the aspect of sharing your story of generosity with someone else. Would you be willing to do that? In the following weeks, there may be opportunities for you to share the heart behind your commitment (not specific numbers). Prepare yourself now. If asked to share about your journey, what would you say?

4) This particular offering was being received for the churches in Jerusalem – a group of churches who desperately needed the Corinthians help and generosity. As you think about a people group in Wichita who desperately needs our spiritual help and generosity, who comes to mind? How is our Forward campaign helping to make that happen, and what excites you about this as you give?
5) Write out your prayer for these next two years of the Forward campaign. If so bold, share your prayer out loud with the group, and everyone pray for one another as we begin the next two years (and beyond) of this adventure together.
