

No, don't confront.

Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all offenses.

1 Peter 4:8 Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins.

Yes, do confront.

Matthew 18:15 If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone.

Titus 3:10 As for a person who stirs up division, after warning him once and then twice, have nothing more to do with him.

How should I confront?

Generally speaking, we should confront with a noticeable and genuine posture of kindness, honor, and humility.
