### Skill No. 5: Learn the Genre

- **What Are Genres?** *A style or type or form of literature.*
- **History:** Story form of literature, involving plot, setting, and characters.
  - *Genesis; Exodus 1-19; Numbers; Joshua; Judges; Ruth; 1-2 Samuel; 1-2 Kings; 1-2 Chronicles; Ezra; Nehemiah, Esther, Jonah; Acts*
- **Law:** Legal form of literature, involving commands and rules.
  - *Exodus 19-40; Leviticus; Deuteronomy*
- **Poetry:** Poetic form of literature, involving figurative language, repetition, and other poetic devices.
  - *Psalms; Song of Solomon; Lamentations*
- **Prophecy:** Declarative form of literature, involving prediction, exhortation, admonition, and often symbolism.

- *Isaiah, Jeremiah; Ezekiel; Daniel; Hosea; Joel; Amos; Obadiah; Jonah; Micah; Nahum; Habakkuk; Zephaniah; Haggai; Zechariah; Malachi*
- **Letters:** Situational form of literature, involving specific content for specific audiences.
  - *Romans, 1-2 Corinthians; Galatians; Ephesians; Philippians; Colossians; 1-2 Thessalonians; 1-2 Timothy; Titus; Philemon; Hebrews; James; 1-2 Peter; 1-3 John; Jude*
- **Wisdom:** Proverbial form of literature, involving wise sayings, poetic reflection, and practical inquiry.
  - *Job; Proverbs; Ecclesiastes*
- **Gospel:** Eyewitness form of literature, involving historical narrative and parabolic stories.
  - *Matthew; Mark; Luke; John*
- **Apocalypse:** Symbolic form of literature; involving extensive figurative language.
  - *Daniel 7-12; Revelation*
