LUST

Lust: Taking something God created for pleasure, outside His boundaries.

Lust: The lure of lust (Self-indulgence): To lust is to want what you don't have and weren't meant to have. Lust wants to go outside God's guidelines to find satisfaction. Lust grasps for, with your eyes, heart, imagination, or body, what God has said no to. Although lust longs for an object or a person, ultimately this object is not its prize; its goal is the very act of desiring. The result is that lust can never be quenched. As soon as the object of lust is attained, lust wants something more. Lust longs for the forbidden and is willing to take you deeper and farther into perversion than you ever dreamed to go, if you will indulge its latest request.

<u>Lust is always based on the same lie – that satisfaction will be found apart from God</u>. It is the defining struggle of this generation and the central ingredient for a <u>miserable earthly existence</u>. When you choose to lust, you actively <u>reject God</u>. Though the source of lust is your own evil desires, the one who is offended is God. When you choose to lust, you actively reject God. <u>The very nature of lust is to rebel against God</u>.

The only way to be victorious over lust is to believe with your whole heart that God is against your lust not because He is opposed to pleasure, but because He is so committed to it. It is absolutely vital to remember that when God says no to something, it is because He is saying yes to something that will be far better for you. The fire of lust's pleasures must be fought with the fires of God's pleasures.
